From Nina Frost Close:**Are You Bringing Advent?**

Yes, you.

The season of Advent started recently, and it ushers in a time rich in symbolism and expectancy... a time of waiting, longing, hope, and the promise of incarnation, the coming of Jesus into our midst, in whatever surprising ways that may manifest.

I tend to think of Advent spirit as something to receive gratefully, or at least hope for. Yet we are called to create it, to bring it, to offer it as much as receive it. And that can, and should, happen year round.

In this spirit, I found myself thinking of a writing teacher I had the spring of sophomore year in college, a time of panic and floundering. My firm and happy plans of majoring in Psychology had run into the brick wall (for me) known as statistics, and I had failed, literally. Somehow an unfathomable prerequisite, no statistics meant no Psychology degree.

So that spring I had washed ashore into a beloved fallback, English, and had also elected to take a non-fiction writing class that was studying essays. In the first class the professor told us we would be reading Annie Dillard, John McPhee, Virginia Woolf, George Orwell, and more. And he gave us our first, seemingly basic assignment: To write about a noun. Unaccountably, I picked "wanderlust," a word few would associate with me, but the words came smooth and fast and surprising... their own Advent.

In the second class, he read my essay aloud, anonymously, and professed his delight. In that moment, that astounding and unexpected moment, without knowing it, he confirmed that I indeed had a place there, that statistics haplessness notwithstanding, I was not a fluke, not a failure, that I had something to say, some work to be done in the world. I would not have used this language at the time, but this blessing was the work of incarnation, an encouragement to come forth in a tangible way.

The light in the darkness comes in many ways, at many times. As Advent celebrates the birth of Christ, we are called to help birth others, to call them forth, to recognize something they cannot see on their own.

Between now and Christmas, think of ways you are being called forth... what parts of you are waiting to be born. And think of those in your life—family, friends, colleagues or strangers—who need your word of life-giving encouragement. Bring some Advent this season.

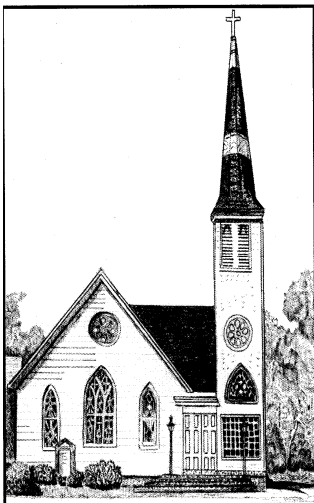
